

## Golden Arrow District 2009 Honor Unit Requirements

*The GAD Honor Unit Award was created in 2003 to recognize those GAD Packs, Troops, Teams, Crews, and Ships that conduct a quality Scouting program in a manner that support the District's efforts to earn the National Quality District Award and to meet the goals set by the Council in the areas of Membership, Finance and Program. Qualifying as a GAD Honor Unit is recognized by a limited-edition temporary patch for each of the unit's officially registered members (both youth and adult) as of December 31 of the year for which the award is earned. Patches are usually available at District Dinner.*

### Unit Standard

- ❑ Earn Centennial Quality Award 2009
- ❑ 100% Boys Life 2009

### Friends of Scouting Standard

- ❑ Turn in 2010 FOS Unit Coordinator contact information<sup>‡</sup> and date for 2010 presentation by the deadline given in the 2009-10 GAD Calendar
- ❑ Family FOS 2010 Unit Coordinator attends training on the date announced in the 2009-10 GAD Calendar

### Unit Planning Standard

- ❑ Turn in the unit's 2009-10 Calendar at September 2009 Roundtable

### Unit Fundraising Standard

- ❑ Sell an average of \$50 of Popcorn per registered Scout based on August 1, 2009, Council membership report
- ❑ Participate in Scout Fair with a booth and sell Scout Fair tickets in 2009
- Turn in 2009 Scout Fair Ticket Sales Coordinator contact information<sup>‡</sup> by the February 11, 2009

### Training Standard

- ❑ Ensure 50% of "direct contact" adult leaders are "trained for their current position" by December 31, 2009
- Unit attends 6 or more Roundtables in 2009

### Public Relations Standard

- ❑ Publish, and submit to Council, 9 or more Scouting publicity articles about your unit [newspaper articles, announcements, web pages, TV coverage, church bulletins, and marquee announcements] in 2009

### Membership Standard

- Hold a Spring recruiting rally before April 30, 2009
- ❑ Turn in Membership Recruiting Coordinator (School Night To Join Scouting Coordinator for Packs, various other positions for other unit types) contact information<sup>‡</sup> by June 2009 Roundtable
- Membership Recruiting Coordinator attends one SNTJS Kickoff meeting in August 2009
- ❑ Conduct a Fall recruiting rally during September, 2009

### Program Standard

- ❑ Participate in a Council or District event for your program in 2009
- Attend long-term Summer Camp specific for your program area, i.e., Twilight Camp, Cub Scout Resident Camp, Boy Scout Summer Camp, and Crew in 2009
- Participate in a non-Scout-sponsored public event as a unit (e.g., march in a community parade) in 2009
- Conduct a minimum of 6 unit level special outings / events during 2009 (Council and District events count)
- (*Troops only*) Five percent of the Scouts registered on December 31, 2009, have attended a District or Council youth leadership training program for Den Chief, Chaplain's Aide or Troop Guide, the National Youth Leadership Training or the National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience programs, or have served as youth staff on any of these programs

- = Complete at least 3 out of 8
